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A Chairde,

It has come to that time of the year again and we have completed our underage calendar for 2025.

The Bord na nÓg have overseen over 3,000 competitive games in 2025 and well in excess of 5,000 Go Games in 2025. Credit for this is due to a number of people who all played their part in making it all happen.

The FRC were set up in 2024 to look at the rules of football and see if they could make recommendations to improve the games. They made a host of recommendations and the Mayo Bord na nÓg met early in January to discuss and make the changes that we believed would help the underage in Mayo GAA. There was a lot of early nervousness about the rules and how would we adapt to them. We aided the integration of these new rules by sending a 4th official to all our U16 and U18 league games. We continued the 4th official for our U18 championship as it was felt that our U16 were managing to cope with them by mid-summer. As the year progressed, we found that clubs and referees had quickly adapted to the new rules.

We would like to congratulate the F.R.C. for bringing a new dimension to our games of football and for making it as exciting as possible. We think we can safely say on behalf of everyone, they definitely have worked for the better. It should also be noted that our referees in Mayo adapted to these new rules in a timely fashion.

In 2025, we instructed all those who presented cups and shields to give a special thank you to the parents of players as without their input, support and encouragement we would see more children than ever before leaving our games. The Bord na nÓg acknowledges the importance of parents being involved with their children at underage

but also advise that it is good for the children to have new experiences by being managed/coached by others and playing of other sports.

We started our year in mid-March with the minor and U16 leagues kicking off. This year, we did not start our U14 until after the time change. The U12 started in mid-April before the U10 and U8 all started in early May.

Our League competitions of Minor/U16/U14/U12 games was 93% of all games completed. Again, this year there five games in the U16 last round of the league all conceded. Steps must be taken in 2026 to stop this from happening again. We had one club who conceded an U14 league final.

Our championship competition of Minor/U16/U14 games was 95% of all games completed.

We had made a change to the format of the lower divisions in minor to ensure equal game time for all but two of the county semi-finals were conceded. We also had an U14 B championship semi-final conceded.

The uneven age grades got underway ad soon as the championship were finished. We had an average of 95.4% completion of all games at U17/15/13. The high completion rate suggests that clubs are very much in favour of the competition.

Our Go Games blitzes have now taken an integral part within the club calendars and with full buy in by all clubs have become very successful. Thank you to all our Go Games coaches.

In 2025, we started a campaign to ensure that every club had one full member who had completed an online Go Games refereeing course and I'm delighted to report that every club complied with the regulation.

Feile

National Feile asked us to put in 3 teams in Division 1, 2 and 3 this year. We had 34 teams take part in 3 divisions. Some clubs withdrew on the day, and this is always an issue as it leaves us without meaningful games for a lot of teams. We held our Feile round robins in 11 venues in Mayo, and our Feile finals were held on Sunday May 11th in the Connacht C.O.E.

In late May we were contacted by the National Feile and asked to put in another club for the Regional Feile in the Connacht COE on June 28th. Louisburg won the playoff. Congratulations to Islandeady who won the Region 2 shield and to Kiltimagh who won the Region 9 Cup.

Minor League & Championship

As minor in Mayo is now under-18, we have asked clubs not to play minor players in their divisional competitions. Where the overall majority complied with this,

unfortunately, there are reports of some clubs trying to play minor players in divisional competitions.

Minor player now come under so much pressure to play football, study for exams, other sports and so on, that it is not advisable to put even more pressure on them to start playing for adult teams in April and May. The Bord na nÓg have a motion for our county convention in December on this.

The leagues started in mid-March and were fully completed by end of May. We had a three-week break for the exams and then we went straight into divisional competitions. These ran for 4 weeks from end of June to mid-July.

Our championship started in July and ran until the end of August. We took almost two weeks of a break in early August after the bank holiday weekend. This break did allow some clubs to reschedule their second-round games. In 2026, we will be taking more steps to introduce breaks into the minor championships. Rounds 1 and 2 will both have breaks to allow for postponement of games. All of minor finals were evenly competitive and all were in the melting pot within the last quarter.

The Minor A & B finals drew a crowd well over 2,000 into Hastings Insurance MacHale Park and anyone in attendance were treated to a festival of all of what is good in football under the new rules.

County Minors 2025

David Heaney and Tom O'Reilly were selected to stay on as managers in 2025. They wasted no time in selecting their squad in early January. They trained three times a week from early January to late March. There were interruptions from storms and twice they called off training to allow players play with their schools.

Their Connacht championship campaign started on Friday 28th March at home to Leitrim, which they won.

Round 2 was away to Roscommon which they lost by 9 points to a very strong Roscommon team.

Round 3 saw us home to Sligo and back to winning ways again. Round 4 ended up as a dead rubber game as both Mayo and Galway would meet again the following week to play the semi-final. We may have lost by the narrowest of margins in Tuam but won the semi-final in Hastings Insurance MacHale Park the following week.

We would go on to lose the Connacht final in Hastings Insurance MacHale Park to Roscommon.

We still qualified for the All-Ireland quarter final which led us to playing the Leinster champions, Offaly in Roscommon. A huge congratulations to our lads who dug deep in the last five minutes and beat a heavily supported Offaly team and set up a semi-final place against Kerry. The Offaly supporters were able to travel in large numbers to this game due to the fact that all the busses were free and paid for by the clubs in the county. It really made for a very exciting game and an experience that none of the minor squad will ever forget.

The All-Ireland Semi-final was held in Ennis, and it certainly wasn't from the lack of effort that we lost it, but it was a stellar performance from our minors this year.

Congratulations to Ben Holmes who was nominated for the Electric Ireland Minor team of the year.

David and Toms tenure as joint managers has now come to an end and we would like to say a thank you to their backroom of Alan Molloy, Pat Clarke, Brian Kilkelly, Ritchie Byrne, Brendan Murphy, Eddie Doran and Dr. Pat O'Toole for all their hard work behind the scenes.

We would like to take this opportunity of welcoming, Diarmuid Byrne as Minor team manager in 2026 and wish him and his backroom of Ger Brady, Michael Smyth, Paddy Hopkins and Paul Kane all the success in 2026.

U16 League and Championship

Just like our minors, the U16 league starts in March to allow for the exam break in June. This year was another exceptional year at U16 football, and all of our leagues were completed by end of May. One issue of note was again this year where there were a lot of concessions of games in the last round of the league. We introduced shield finals to try and eliminate this, but they just proved to a nightmare to organise and play. These will definitely be scrapped in 2026.

The U16 started the divisional competitions in June after the exams before heading into the championship. Their championship ran alongside the minor championship. In 2026 we will be making a slight change to their fixtures to further allow postponing games and allowing cross over of players by playing championship on alternative weeks.

U14 League and Championship

We took the decision not to start the U14 leagues until after the time change this year as we don't have to suspend games for the national exams. This proved to be very popular and allowed for an easier playing of league games. We played their league right into June. There was a clash with a national soccer tournament in Limerick that some clubs had issues with. Unfortunately, we had given a commitment to divisional boards that we would not infringe of their dates with our leagues and were forced to play the league finals in the calendar date. We have made adjustments to our calendar in 2026 to allow for clashes going forward.

Their championship ran very smoothly, and we ended up with some very exciting finals in late August in Hastings Insurance MacHale Park.

U16 & U14 Development Leagues and Championships.

The inclusion of development leagues in Mayo has been one of the most important leagues to help develop players and to give proper game time to players who may not make your clubs first team.

Their games now have become very competitive, and we saw all of their championship finals go right down to the last score of the games. The only finals that went to extra time this year were development finals.

We would encourage any club who have 25/26 players to consider fielding a second team at U14/16/18. The development games are played on Saturday and Sundays. There are still some managers out there who believe that winning is all it is about. We have taken steps over the last few years to curb this, but we can only act on official acts. We cannot act on rumour. We have deducted points from teams that have resulted in them losing out on a final spot and we even have gone so far as to remove teams from competitions as a result of investigations.

If you believe that the team you are playing, may be playing illegal players, please tell the referee to put in a report. You can also ask your club secretary to ask us to investigate an allegation of illegal players.

U12 Go Games Leagues

This year was without doubt the biggest leagues at U12 with the greatest number of teams and players than ever before.

The Bord na nÓg over the last few years have tried where possible to stick to 8 team leagues. This maximises potential playing games for all teams and allows for a more competitive grading. The U12 leagues though are not without their own issues. Getting referees have always proved difficult for them but the inclusion of club Go Games referees have proven quite successful.

Trying to match teams for the summer league, so we can start to grade teams, comes with difficulty. The system run by the Bord na nÓg for the summer leagues, so we can start grading teams has been successful when you see that we had 64 teams playing in the U13 leagues and all games were competitive. By starting the grading at the summer leagues has helped the Bord na nÓg reduce the number of games where teams are receiving a terrible beating.

Uneven-age grading leagues

These leagues have become very popular and are a great addition to our calendar. They are an ideal competition for clubs to play players who wouldn't normally get games. They have one of the highest completions rates this year with two of the competitions recording a 100% completion rate.

These leagues were first started a couple of years ago and were always an optional tournament to enter. They are run in September/October and come with the most difficulty. Schools are back and they have their own games midweek. In Spring, the schools don't have near as many games as they do in the Autumn. Therefore, we will need to make additional adjustments to these leagues. We will have to try and finish them by the first week or so in October. The further into the Autumn we go, the more probability of getting games cancelled due to unplayable pitches increases.

The last two years we have used the Connacht C.O.E. to make sure we have pitches to play these finals. We wish to thank Connacht GAA for their help and support in playing these finals in a time when club pitches are in short supply.

Under 10 & Under 8's.

This year we followed on from our very successful running mixture of Go Games and Blitzes.

We have 3 Go Games and 7 blitzes for the Under 10's.

We have 6 Go Games and 4 blitzes for the Under 8's.

This format is proving to be very successful and very well attended by clubs.

This year we kept the blitzes to a max of 4 teams and used the last two blitzes to increase the numbers, however in 2026, we will be keeping the max to a solid 4 for all the blitzes held in club grounds. We also plan on introducing more Go Games for Under

10's. Maybe look at a home and away arrangement for them but ultimately, we will be introducing more Go Games for them in 2026.

The end of year blitzes in the Connacht COE have gone from strength to strength. This year, we broke the 1,000-attendance mark at the Under 8 blitz. The Under 10's almost broke the 1,000 mark this year. We had a full house for the Under 10's though as every single pitch was in use. We even contemplated using the patch of grass between pitches this year!

The Bord na nÓg could not do this without the help and support from our four divisional boards. They have been our partners in this project for the last three years and when they were asked to financially support the blitzes, they did not hesitate to assist.

Mid-Year Review + Grade Meetings

Over the last few years, we have included a mid-year review for the Bord na nÓg. This is proving very successful and allows clubs that chance to help the Bord na nÓg make improvements where and if needed.

It is a simple workshop. Three questions,

1. What is working well?
2. What is not working well?
3. What can we do to improve?

Highlighted issues this year were,

Inconsistent refereeing, black card rules at underage, U14 League finals clashes with a national soccer tournament and numbers for the Go Games U12/10/8. These numbers are sought too early, and registration has still to take place.

Just prior to each age grade starting we have introduced a meeting for the manager and coaches for those grades. These have proved to be very popular and well attended. It is a great way for us to communicate directly with managers and get their opinions prior to the start of their year.

We have had a lot of suggestions from clubs for introduction of an app like they do in soccer. We would welcome this but must abide by governance from Croke Park and they tell us that they are attempting to develop one. There is a lot of cost in operating an app like this and that needs to be addressed.

Grading

One of the most difficult tasks over the last few years has been grading. However, the 8 teams playing per division and continuous grading from competition to competition has proven to be very successful. The Bord na nÓg use your championship standing as its primary reference for grading and will continue to do this.

Suggestion is to rename the grading leagues to Autumn Leagues. The Grading Leagues only allow for a small part of your grading.

Calendar

The calendar has now become the absolute structure behind the Bord na nÓg's ability to finish over 80 competitions every year. By sticking to it, it gives structure and support to clubs so they can plan for events outside our organisation. When Charlie Lambert and Brian O'Malley met with Mayo Soccer, it was apparent that we needed to keep our competitions from clashing as it would support both organisations. The Bord na nÓg also have to avoid clashes with school's football games, exams and any number of unforeseen situations.

One of the most requests for postponements is from bereavements. This is one of the hardest things to have to deal with. We are faced with this at least twice a week in the height of games. The protocol is, 'unless the deceased has a direct involvement in the team, the game must go ahead.' Grandparents of a player or parents of a manager/trainers unfortunately, are not directly involved in the child's team. We have circa 10,000 children playing our games and the odds of a grandparent passing away is extremely high. We do listen to club requests and in the unfortunate circumstances where there is a direct connection, the Bord na nÓg postpone the game and refix it. Ultimately, every single one of these requests are dealt with as a unique situation as it affects each and every single person differently.

It seems now that you haven't done your leaving cert exam now until you have done a week on a Spanish holiday spot. Clubs have had a lot of stress with the make-up of the minor championship where in round two, winners play winners and loser plays loser. This almost ensures that every team is still in with a chance of reaching the semi-finals right down to the last game. The issue is, everyone must play round 1 as early as possible so we can do the draw and start deciding and getting neutral venues. Our calendar in 2026 will hopefully reflect that we have listened to your concerns and made the adjustments needed.

Academy report.

2025 was another very successful year for the academy squads. We continued to field 2 teams at U16 and U15 as well as 4 regional squads at U14.

Both our 15s and 16s squads started with open trials in the regions in February. Squads were then selected and training commenced in mid-March.

Our U16s lead by Eamonn Smith competed in the Buncrana and Ted Webb cups. In the Ted Webb group phase, we played Meath, Kerry and Laois. We started this campaign with an away loss to Meath but bounced back with draws against Kerry and Laois. Unfortunately, we missed out of the cup semifinal on score difference and went into the shield. We then went onto play a strong Westmeath team and finished the national campaign with a draw against Dublin. Our other squad played in the Buncrana cup which culminated in a narrow loss to Tyrone in the final of that competition. In the

group phase our first game was an away draw to Tyrone. This was followed by 2 big wins against Down and Armagh. That put us into the semi-final against Dublin. After a cracking game in Hastings Insurance MacHale Park our boys came out on top after extra time. That then put us into the final in Buncrana a game we lost by 2 points in a quality game.

All these boys now move forward into trials for the county U17 team for 2026. We'd like to thank Eamon Smith, Ger Brady, Michael Smyth, Paul Kane, Eoin Sweeney, Paddy Hopkins and Diarmuid Byrne (who joined the group after the U17s finished) for all their hard work and dedication with this group over the last number of years.

The U15s were also super competitive and played in the Adam Magan Offaly and Adam Mangan Kilclonfert competitions. In the group stages we had 2 games against, Kildare, Meath and Kerry. Our first team won against Kidare and Meath while losing narrowly to Kerry. Meanwhile our second won one and lost the other 2 in 3 very competitive games. That put us into the cup semi-final for Mayo 1 against Offaly. Our boys played very well in a high scoring game and won by 5 points which put them into the final and another chance to take on Kerry. This time the result was different with the lads playing very well to lift the cup after 2-point win. In the meantime, Mayo 2 lost out narrowly to Clare and were defeated in their final game by a strong Galway team. Huge credit must go to John Comer and his management team of Cian Monaghan, John Sammon, Shaun Boyle, Martin Costello, John Dunne, Sean McAndrew.

In 2025 our U14 went back to the region for their full programme. This worked very well with each squad doing 20 sessions and playing 5 game days between April and start of September. All game were in blitz formats in Began with the exception of our final gameday which took place in Dungaany where all 4 of our teams won their games. We would like to thank the 4 regional leads, Tom Walsh, Emmet O'Connor, Aidan Gill and Tim Moriarty as well as all the coaching support they received in the regions. The highlight of their year was undoubtedly their 2-day camp in Castlebar over the Halloween break where over 100 players took part in skills testing, physical testing, coaching sessions with some of county players, bio banded games and finished with some very wise words from our new county manager Andy Moran. All groups will now progress into their winter programmes.

Mayo post primary schools' committee run 20 football competitions and two hurling competitions.

Schools Football Meeting Report,

This year, officers from Bord na nÓg, the academy staff, the hurling committee and the schools committee met and discussed possible promotion ideas for schools' football and hurling.

We discussed ideas of how to promote the games and how to improve relationships between Clubs and Schools. Clubs in Mayo contribute €150 each towards schools' football and Mayo GAA add to this to make it a €500 voucher to every school in Mayo for purchasing of playing equipment. Many issues that restrict more playing of games were highlighted and they are,

1. When a team have to travel to play, substitute teachers have to be used to cover the classes that the team coaches are missing. This incurs a considerable cost and burden on resources in the school.
2. We looked at the idea of playing games outside of school hours, but it was felt that it would be too much to impose on teachers' personal time.
3. Lack of access for teachers to training courses for football and hurling.
4. Costs. Every school when playing away, must pay for a bus.
5. Some clubs charge their local schools for the use of their facilities, even though, these players are also their own members.
6. Interest from principals. Schools are first and foremost centres of academic learning and not sporting centres. Principals are already struggling with the resources they already have, without adding a further burden on them.
7. Time of year. Access to pitches and resources are restricted during the winter months.

What can we, as clubs and county board do to help with these difficulties?

1. Our club coaches and trainers can go to the schools to help and assist the teachers in coaching the sports. They do have to comply with school's regulations beforehand though. They will need to have the schools Garda Vetting and safeguarding in place.
2. Clubs will have to look at the practice of charging their schools for the use of facilities that would otherwise be empty during school hours. Support, not discourage.

3. Mayo Coaching academy to assist by organising and/or providing periodical training sessions for teachers here in Hastings Insurance MacHale Park.
4. Club volunteers to assist the school's committee to ensure that their members are getting football and hurling in schools.
5. Look at the feasibility of playing the Flanagan Cup final under lights on a Friday night or alternatively on a day when parents and supporters can attend.

Referees

“No Referees, No Games.”

We would like to thank all the referees in Mayo who quite regularly answer the call (or text) when asked to do a game. There is a cohort of referees who will go any distance to cover any games and without them, we would be in a very different position.

It must be added, where the new rules have improved our games, they have also added to our burden on referees. One of the highlighted issues from the June Mid-Year review was inconsistent refereeing. One of the reasons could now be the chopping and changing of rules and the inclusion of ‘and/or’ rules. These are rules where an offence has occurred, but the referee now has to decide which option to use, whether to advance the ball, issue a card to an offender or award the free in another part of the pitch. I firmly believe that Croke Park need to define these rules more and settle on the maximum penalty for a foul rather than ‘and/or’.

Each club in Mayo were asked to provide the Bord na nÓg with a certified Go Games referee. Every single club complied with this requirement. In 2026, these records will

have to be updated by clubs. We ask that please be active. We plan of using these referees for our Blitzes in 2026.

The Bord na nÓg welcome the new referees charter that is under discussion at the moment. We have pushed hard to include a quota requirement for referees to do our underage games. It has been a struggle to get the U12 filled every single week and with this initiative, it is hoped to ease that pressure. The Bord na nÓg will set out the quota every January for the year ahead.

U12 is the first time a player will have played in a game with an official referee. Due to this, the Bord na nÓg see the referee role at U12 as more a rules coach than an assessor of the game. We encourage referees to speak to the players and managers and to make it very clear what rule has been breached and what the penalty is.

In 2026, we plan on bringing in a policy on how to referee U12 games to make this role easier on our referees.

Other Sport Clashes

Every year we are presented with an ever-increasing number of events that clash. It's either Soccer, Basketball, Rugby, Horse riding, Running and many, many more sports. We do our best to try and avoid clashes where possible, but it is an almost impossibility to avoid them all.

We work closely with our colleagues in the schools committee to try and avoid clashes, but schools play their games during the winter and their window of opportunity to play is limited so they may have to postpone their games on top of ours. We do work with them to try and limit this. Our calendar this year will clearly show the dates for schools and our catch-up weeks are aliened.

Over the last few years, we have reached an understanding with Mayo Soccer to avoid clashes with our primary age grades, and this has worked very well at Minor/U16 and U14. There are still clashes every summer, in June and July, at the U12 grade but with both sports having such an enormous amount of players at this grade it is impossible to please everyone. We do introduce break weeks to allow clubs move their games. We ask that clubs work together and understand that this clash is coming again in 2026. If both clubs agree to a new date and it doesn't clash with any other fixtures or competitions, we have allowed them to postpone it further than the two weeks allowed. Ultimately, you cannot postpone a game beyond the last round of the league of that competition.

Motions 2025:

Kiltimagh -

- Kiltimagh would propose that the uneven age grading League and the Bord nóg Championships swap place in the calendar. This would limit the amount of players who are unavailable for championship fixtures due to the holiday season.

As minor is now an adult competition, this would have to be agreed with the C.C.C. and our schools as there would be a major crossover of players. It is decided to leave this with the C.C.C. for their consideration.

Ballintubber -

- That a minimum of at least 1 week be given off between the end of the even age competition and the start of the odd age gradings.

The Bord na nÓg are taking steps to try and elevate the length of time between competitions. This is evident in our calendar in 2026. If we have the weather on our side in late August, this will not be an issue.

- That player numbers be taken into account when grouping teams so that teams with 14/15 players are not paired up with teams of 25/26 players. This would help ensure more game time for all.

We already do at Go Games but it cannot be done for grading purposes and so we cannot allow this motion.

- Consideration be given when setting fixtures to avoid the clash between football and soccer which is proving problematic particularly for clubs who have smaller numbers.

We have met with soccer and agreed our calendars. If teams move their games to another day, it will affect you. Our calendar is reflective of how we move to avoid soccer.

Moy Davitts -

- While Blitzes provide valuable game time at U10 level, coaches feel that players are not getting sufficient football throughout the season. It is proposed that the County Bord na nÓg consider introducing league-style fixtures for U10s, structured around club numbers, to take place on Saturday mornings during the early part of the season.

Noted and provided for in our calendar in 2026. The amount of U10 Go Games will double in 2026.

- It has been noted that underage players involved in the Mayo development setup are being asked not to play for their clubs. For smaller clubs, this presents a significant challenge, particularly when it involves fringe players. It is proposed that the County Bord na nÓg review this policy to ensure balance between club and county

The Bord na nÓg have refereed this back to our academy for their own review. The Bord na nÓg already have a policy of 'No academy player is permitted to play for a club development team.'

Balla -

- That underage competitions are organised so that younger ages play earlier in the week. This is to ensure that where clubs have to play players from the lower age groups in higher age teams, those players are able to give their best to their own age teams before being called on by the older teams.

Struck out as it would cause havoc with the agreements in place already. Steps have been taken in the calendar to limit overextended players.

Lahardane MacHales -

- Mayo Gaa Bord na Nog should be using an App for all under age teams. Players register with their club and should upload the named teams for various age grades and competitions. (Like other sporting organisations)

We would welcome this but unfortunately, this is not in place yet. We await direction from Croke Park on this.

- Second and Third team regulation information is not easily accessible by opposing teams. Eg where are the list of players that only play A named and likewise with third team where is the list that can only play B.

G.D.P.R. Only the club secretary has access to this file.

- Competitions are ran on the same night only until qualifying stage. Semifinals and Finals are given different dates and venues for the same age grade during competitions unlike the LGFA where all finals are held in the same venue on the same day at different times which illuminates any overlapping of players on second and third teams and allows for a more structured competitive competition.

This would be in direct conflict with policy and ethos of the Bord na nÓg, of providing game time in a competitive game for every single player.
