Juniors Take Centre Stage



Today's Junior A Football Championship Final is set to be an intriguing East Mayo showdown as both Eastern Gaels and Kiltimagh meet at Mayo GAA HQ. This will be Eastern Gaels' first county final in their 41-year history, and no doubt they will call on the experience of last year's Senior Football League Division Three title success. Kiltimagh will be eager to claim some coveted silverware, which would be the ideal housewarming present for their fabulous newly redeveloped Gilmartin Park.

In their semi-final, Eastern Gaels defeated many people's favourites for the Junior A Championship Bonniconlon, so Kiltimagh will have to tread carefully as the blue and gold hold no fear and will enter this game in a buoyant mood. Eastern Gaels scored 1-11 in their historic semi-final victory against Bonniconlon, but they will probably need to improve on that scoring return if they hope to be crowned champions today. Eastern Gaels have a very young panel, and this is a result of the great work being done at underage level. If this game is still in the melting pot entering the final 10 minutes, then the energy that the blue and gold can call upon from their bench could be crucial and might get them over the finishing line.

Having suffered relegation last year, Kiltimagh will be eager to make an instant return to intermediate level. There is a feel-good factor in the club especially with the opening of their redeveloped Gilmartin Park. The blue and white have a nice blend of youth and experience in their panel and their strength in depth was a crucial factor in their semi-final victory against Ardagh.

This game should be an epic East Mayo showdown.

The Junior B Football Championship Final between Kilmovee Shamrocks and Killala has the makings of a classic encounter. Last year, Kilmovee lost to Achill in the Junior B Final and the green and gold will be eager to atone for that defeat and claim some coveted silverware.

The East Mayo men defeated Swinford in what was a keenly contested semi-final clash, and the Kilmovee management will hope that game will stand to their troops as they face a rejuvenated Killala. Kilmovee Shamrocks' manager Ciaran Flatley won a precious Junior B county final medal eight years ago with Kilmovee, and he wants this current crop of players to have that winning feeling at Hastings Insurance MacHale Park. No doubt the loyal band of Shamrocks' supporters will bring plenty of colour and noise to Mayo GAA HQ and occasions like today are cherished memories for supporters.



Today will also see the 2000 Mayo Junior A football champions Killala honoured as the jubilee team, and the loyal blue and white supporters might hope that capturing a Junior B title could be the start of another odyssey for the north Mayo side. Killala have been an improving side as the season has progressed, and they defeated four in a row chasing Achill in what was a hard-fought semi-final victory. The blue and white seem to be building momentum at a crucial juncture in the championship.

Today's showdown between Kilmovee Shamrocks and Killala should be a keenly contested final, and it may take more than 60 minutes to determine a winner.

Eastern Gaels

The Eastern Gaels club was founded in 1984, the centenary year of the Association, in the rural East Mayo parish of Began, since 2012 very familiar to GAA fans across the country as the location of the Connacht Centre of Excellence, the headquarters of Connacht GAA, and one of the largest indoor sports domes in the world.

The club is affiliated to the East Mayo GAA Board, and fields teams at all levels from underage up to Junior. The club's home pitch is situated on the N60 at Brickens, about midway between Ballyhaunis and Claremorris. The club crest is akin to a mission statement, three crosses represent the three church areas of the parish – Began, Brickens & Logboy – while the sun descending behind the Reek suggests the view or vision shared by all three. During the century before the foundation of Eastern Gaels, there were several attempts at establishing a club in the parish, but none were sustained. There are records of games involving teams from Began, Brickens, and Logboy in earlier years, while a club was formed in Began in 1956 and revived between 1970 and 1973, both of which were affiliated to the South Mayo GAA Board.

Since 1984, the club has enjoyed success at divisional and county level. An initial Canon Henry Cup success in 1988 was followed by East Mayo Junior titles in 1989, 1994 and 2001. At county level, the highlights were Junior B successes in

2019, a first adult county title, and 2021. Underage success came in 1993, when the county Minor B title was won with victory over Louisburgh, and further county titles came at U16D in 2007 and 2017, U14C in 2005, 2007 and 2019, and U14D in 2016. In recent years Eastern Gaels have joined very successfully with Ballyhaunis under the St. Jarlath's banner.

For one of the youngest clubs in Mayo, Eastern Gaels have produced their fair share of players who have represented their county. During the 1900s, Kevin Comer represented his county at Minor, U21 and Junior level, winning an All-Ireland medal in the latter grade in 1997. More recently, a crop of talented underage players have seen Senan Guilfoyle, Dara Flanagan and Tom Hession win Connacht Minor medals with Mayo, with Tom captaining them to Kilcoyne Cup success in 2024. Joe Gilmore, who an All-Ireland U21 medal with Mayo in 1983, later played with the club, while perhaps the most famous GAA player from the parish was Mick Raftery, an All-Ireland Junior and League medal winner with Mayo and an All-Ireland Senior and League medal winner with Galway, and the holder of a record number of Sigerson Cup medals won with UCG during the 1930s and 1940s. The ladies two have made their mark. Bree and Mae Hession, sisters of Tom, have played with Mayo at all grades in recent years. Today Eastern Gaels appear in their first Mayo Junior A Final against their East Mayo neighbours Kiltimagh, having failed at the semi-final stage on their previous forays out of East Mayo.



Kiltimagh

Kiltimagh played their first game in 1884 against Milltown and in 1888 a meeting was called to form a GAA club in the town. In the early years the club was known by different names, three of which were Kiltimagh John Dillons, Kiltimagh Davitts, and Kiltimagh Plunketts. The club won its

first title in 1914, the County Junior championship. They again won the Junior championship in 1919. The 1930s heralded a very successful period, with the winning of the Junior again in 1932, and Intermediate championships in 1933 and 1934. The club won Junior twice more before the end of the decade, in 1936 and 1939, and so completed a decade of achievement.

Kiltimagh's next appearance in a Junior final was in 1955, when they were beaten by a great Crossmolina team. 1967 saw the club win the Junior championship when they overcame neighbours Balla in the final. Three Mayo Juvenile (Under-16) titles were won between 1967 and 1969. At the beginning of the 1970s Kiltimagh enjoyed great underage success, winning a County Minor title in 1971, having lost the 1970 final, and they also won the inaugural Under-21 championship in 1970. Intermediate success followed in 1978.

Into the 1980s, Kiltimagh again reached the Minor final in 1989, where they lost to Balla, but twelve months later they

won the Minor title, overcoming Ballinrobe in the final. 1991 saw a fourth Intermediate title come to the club, and with it promotion to the Senior grade. The highlight of a long run in the senior grade was the club's appearance in the 1997 County Senior final, where they gallantly lost to the great Knockmore team of that period 1-11 to 0-9.

The beginning of the new decade saw a fifth Intermediate title come to Kiltimagh in 2001. The club were back in the Intermediate final again in 2007, but lost out to Ballintubber. In 2008 Kiltimagh were relegated to the Junior grade, the low point in the club's recent history. However they responded by winning the Junior championship in 2009, and they followed on by winning the Connacht Junior club championship, and going all the way to Croke Park on All-Ireland final day, where they lost out narrowly in the Junior Club final. 2009 also saw Kiltimagh reach the Minor County final, where they lost to Castlebar Mitchels.

From 2010 Kiltimagh operated in the Intermediate grade, losing finals to Westport in 2016, Moy Davitts in a 2017 replay and to Balla in 2020. They look to return to the Intermediate grade this afternoon against East Mayo neighbours Eastern Gaels, in a year in which Uachtarán CLG Jarlath Burns recently officially reopened Gilmartin Park following an extensive programme of development of works.

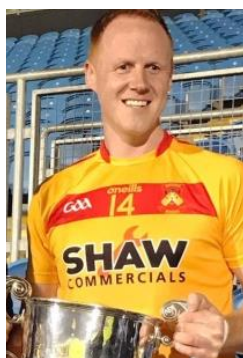

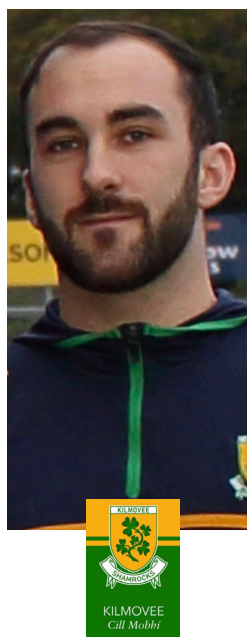

Killala GAA Club

Killala G.A.A. club was founded in 1926, and in 1936 the club affiliated to the North Mayo Board and competed in the junior championship until 1939. From 1939 - 41 the club did not affiliate but did so again in 1942. This was the beginning of the most successful period for the Killala club of the first half of the 20th century. In 1948 they annexed the North Mayo title and went on to win the County Junior title by defeating Louisburgh. This led to the senior championship of 1949 where they were defeated in the County final by Crossmolina. They returned to junior status, but they could not field teams and were dormant from 1952 - 68 at adult level, similar to many other rural clubs at this time. They did though compete at minor, reaching the County final in 1961.

The club was reformed in 1969, and in 1971 the club purchased the field on which our grounds are currently situated from the Land Commission. Over time these were developed, and on the 17th August 1997 the Gerry Maheedy Memorial Park and Andrew Reilly Clubrooms were officially opened by one of the clubs most famous names Dr. Joe

Gilvarry. The facilities were named after two great Killala clubmen who will remain long in our memories.

The year 2000 saw the most historic success so far of the clubs modern era with the capturing of the North Mayo and County Junior titles. In 2001 and 2002 the club competed at intermediate level but without success and returned to junior status in 2003. A losing County Junior final appearance in 2006 against Crossmolina, was followed by a winning return to the final two years later, when Killala beat The Neale in the 2008 final. In both years, Killala represented Mayo in the provincial Junior championship, capturing Connacht honours twice as they overcame Clifden of Galway and Kilglass Gaels of Roscommon respectively. Killala returned to the Junior grade following relegation from Intermediate in 2014, and reached their most recent Junior final in 2015, where they lost out to Ardnaree Sarsfields.

Today they attempt to win the Junior B title for the first time.



Kilmovee Shamrocks

The current Kilmovee Shamrocks club was formed in 1978, but like many rural clubs football was played in the parish in earlier years, without any official club being affiliated. Indeed in 1889, in the early years of the GAA in Mayo, two clubs from the area were registered, Kilkelly Davitts and Kilmovee Crillys.

1934 saw the formation of a club in Kilmovee, and this club existed intermittently over the years, with some lapses when numbers were short. Players from the area played with other clubs when there was no club, most notably with Ballaghaderreen and Aghamore. Indeed in 1977, under the Shamrocks banner, this Aghamore/Kilmovee combination won the County Senior title.

In 1978, Kilmovee Shamrocks formed their own club, and since then they have enjoyed much success at divisional and county level. Canon Henry Cups were won in 1990 and 1997, and East Mayo Junior championships in 1982, 1987, 1990, 1997, 1999, 2008 and 2018. 1990 saw them come very close to landing the Junior A county title, losing the final to Ballinrobe by a single point. The County Junior B title was won in 2017, and an U21C title in 2007.

Underage county titles were won at U14F in 2010, U14E in 2017, U14C in 2020 and a hat-trick of Minor C titles in 2005, 2006 and 2007. Kilmovee Shamrocks have joined up with Charlestown and Ballaghaderreen at different times in recent years, the Sarsfields/Shamrocks combination reaching a Minor A final in 2016, and Ballaghaderreen/Kilmovee winning the Minor B title earlier this year.

Kilmovee Shamrocks play their home games at Canon Henry Park, a ground that was first opened in 1935, again in 1947, and for the third time in 1986 following extensive development work. The clubs facilities have been continuously upgraded and developed in the years since.

Kilmovee Shamrocks ladies have enjoyed their moments in the sun too, winning many county titles at different levels over the years, and having enjoyed provincial success as well, winning a Connacht Intermediate title in 2003. Players such as Denise McDonagh and the Cafferky sisters Lisa and Sinead have represented Mayo with distinction, and are well known to followers of ladies football.

Having lost last year's Junior B final to Acla CLG, Kilmovee Shamrocks return to the final today, hoping to go one step further in 2025.



The Junior final promised to be an intriguing contest with both teams giving me happy memories down throughout the years. We never had a bad day in Kiltimagh with memories of men like Kiernan, Heneghan, Big Tom Byrne, Peter Burke, the McNicholas' and of course John Finn to

name a few. But it was Joseph Gilmartin I remember most. A big man with a big heart, passionate about Kiltimagh football. He held every position in the Club. His son played for Kiltimagh and was also Chairman, while his other son Charlie, won two All-Ireland's in 1977 with St. Colman's in the Hogan Cup and an All-Ireland Minor title in 1978 with Mayo.

Of course, Eastern Gaels had many great men behind the scenes down throughout the years, none more so than Joe Gilmore, a founder member of the Club. This man was legendary in GAA circles and will we ever forget his passionate speech on the bonnet of his car in Brickens! Joe's son, Joe, also played with the Club and won All-Ireland with Mayo in 1983. Other names that come to mind are Tom Connolly, Kevin Connolly and Brendan

Morley to name but a few. Kiltimagh will be attempting to get back to the intermediate ranks again with a victory today, while Eastern Gaels will be trying to atone for their semi final defeat to Bonniconlon last year. Eastern Gaels have been progressing steadily down throughout the years and won their first County Title last year, winning Division Three. Having gone undefeated for the whole league, it promises to be a marvellous final with the experienced Kiltimagh side taking on a youthful Eastern Gaels team. I am expecting the title to go East, there could be some celebrations in Brickens on Sunday night.

It's hard to believe it is 17 years since Killala won the Connaught Junior final in Ballina, with Ronan Clarke lifting the Cup. They will be trying to lift some more silverware when they take on Kilmovee Shamrocks in the County Junior B final. Kilmovee accounted for Swinford in a very tough semi-final, while Killala accounted for Achill in the other Semi. Killala suffered some very narrow defeats in the Junior A Championship and it will stand to them in this final. They have a bit more experience than Kilmovee and I expect the Treanlaur Cup to be heading to North Mayo Sunday night.

Killala 1-8 The Neale 0-8

2000 saw Killala win their first Mayo Junior title in 52 years, when they overcame their South Mayo opponents on a scorline of 1-8 to 0-8. Whilst only one score separated the teams at the finish, in truth the North Mayo side were much the dominant team, a wide tally of 21 reflecting their outfield superiority throughout the game.

Early points from Rory Hannick and Ronan Clarke gave Killala the perfect start before The Neale came back to lead briefly. Two points from Hannick and one from Dominick Herbert put the seashiders back in front, before a Rory Hannick goal in the 21st minute extended their lead. They would not score again until six minutes before the end, and by half-time, The Neale had reduced their advantage to 1-5 to 0-5.

Scores were hard to come by in the second-half, as The

Neale reduced the margin to the minimum with time ticking away. However late points from scorer in chief Rory Hannick with two and substitute Pat Bilbow saw Killala home to a deserved victory.

Pete was a well-known and respected building contractor, and after emigrating to England he became a director with Wimpies. He was a great Mayo supporter throughout his life, and was noted for befriending and employing emigrants

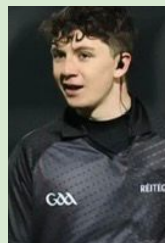

1. All persons entering this ground are admitted only subject to the following Ground Regulations and to the Rules and Regulations of the Gaelic Athletic Association. Entry to the ground shall be deemed to constitute unqualified acceptance of all these Rules and Regulations.
2. Mayo GAA reserve the right of admission to Hastings Insurance MacHale Park.
3. The instructions of Stewards must be obeyed at all times.
4. All persons entering the ground agree to be searched by a member of An Garda Síochána.
5. Every person entering the ground must have a ticket.

6. The following are not permitted:

- 6.1 Bringing into the ground fireworks, smoke canisters, bottles, glass, cans, flags, banners, poles, distress signals, laser pointers, and similar articles or containers, which could or might be used as a weapon.
- 6.2 Bringing of alcohol or controlled drugs into the ground.
- 6.3 The climbing of floodlights or pylons, stands or other buildings. Such behaviour constitutes trespass to property.
- 6.4 Excessive noise such as that from the use of radio sets, air horns and behaviour likely to cause confusion or nuisance of any kind including foul or abusive language.

- 6.5 Throwing of objects on to the pitch.

6.6 Entry upon the pitch, or engaging in conduct that causes or is likely to cause injury or harm to, or otherwise interferes with, disrupts, hinders or distracts a person playing in, refereeing or otherwise having a role in a match at this ground.

6.7 Any unauthorised contact with the boundary wall or fence surrounding the pitch or incursion onto the pitch. Any such unauthorised contact or incursion constitutes trespass to property.

6.8 Remaining or loitering in any gangway or aisle.

6.9 Behaving in an offensive or indecent manner.

7. If a person commits a trespass, reasonable force may be used to prevent, restrain or terminate such trespass.
8. Where a person is in breach of any of these rules and regulations, or where Mayo GAA believes that a person constitutes a source of danger to others, or to the ground, such person may be refused entry or ejected from the ground, and reasonable force may be used for that purpose.
9. All persons in the ground are reminded of their obligations under Section 18 (3) of the Fire Services Act, 1981, to ensure that behaviour does not present a danger from fire to anyone.



Smoking Policy

Mayo GAA now operates a No Smoking policy, including electronic cigarettes and nicotine vaporisers, in all parts of Hastings Insurance MacHale Park.

1. Tunnel under Main Stand.
2. Tunnel under Tower on the MacHale Road side of ground.
