It doesn't happen too often in Mayo football — a senior championship final replay. It hadn't happened since 2006 before Frank Irwin seized his moment last Sunday.

But such have been the fine margins in this year's competition, few were surprised when Ballina Stephenites and Westport couldn't be separated after seventy minutes of gripping intensity last weekend. Now, the county's two senior titans go again, and you get the feeling this one could be something special.

The drawn game had it all. Moments of brilliance, spells of dominance for both sides, and more than enough drama to whet the appetite for the sequel. Westport looked to have one hand on the Moclair Cup when Brian McDermott hit a score for the ages and Killian Kilkelly nudged them ahead in injury-time. But the Stephenites, showing all the qualities we associate with champions, refused to wilt. Sam Callinan's composure and a fine equaliser from Frank Irwin deep into stoppage time ensured there'd be another chapter in this gripping story.

For manager Niall Heffernan and his seasoned Stephenites panel, the replay offers both an opportunity and a warning. Pat Holmes, meanwhile, will be quietly pleased with how his side rallied when they were eight points down after the first quarter and watched their spiritual leader, Lee Keegan, limp out of the action. That was when the likes of Ben Dovle and Eoghan McLaughlin, still as influential as ever, led by deed rather than word, throwing

themselves into tackles and driving their team forward. And when they needed inspiration last weekend, they found enough of it to fight another

In last Sunday's programme, the roll of honour for clubs, and the list of winning captains from 1888 to 2024 was given. Westport St Patricks, under the joint captaincy of Niall McManamon & Oisin McLaughlin, Mayo Senior champions in 2022, were inadvertently omitted from the roll of honour. These details together with referees and final venues where known can be found on the Mayo GAA website, www.mayogaa.com, under the Club Hub tab.

Willie Boshell (Ballina Stephenites), captain in 1910-1914 and 1924, and Josie Munnelly (Castlebar Mitchels), captain in 1946, 1948, 1951, 1952, 1954 and 1956, head this particular list, captaining their clubs to what was then Ward Cup success on 6 occasions each. Jack Bourke (Ballina Stephenites) was a five time winning captain between 1925 and 1929. Others to captain three or more championship winning teams were Andy Corcoran (Ballina Stephenites) with 4 between 1906 and 1909, John Egan (Castlebar Mitchels) also with 4 1930 - 1932 and 1934, and 3 time winning captains DF (Frank Courell (Ballina Stephenites) in 1916, 1918 and 1920, Gerald Courell (Ballina Stephenites) in 1933, 1935 and 1940, Tommy Grier (Ballycastle) in 1936, 1938 and 1939, Seamie Daly (Castlebar Mitchels) in 1942, 1944 and 1945, and Rory Byrne 2015 - 2017. A number of men also captained two championship winning teams.

One father and son have captained winning teams, DF (Frank) & Gerald Courell, while Tom Byrne, Castlebar Mitchels captain in 1950, was the grandfather of Rory Byrne, both goalkeepers for their club and county. Brothers to have captained winning teams include Murt and Ray Prendergast (West Mayo 1960 & Castlebar Mitchels 1969 & 1970 respectively), Tom (1989) and Noel (1994) Connelly (Hollymount) and Tom (1999 & 2000) and James (2002) Nallen (Crossmolina Deel Rovers).

Rory Byrne heads the list of Moclair Cup winning captains on 3, while Danny Dolan (Garrymore), Ton Nallen (Crossmolina Deel Rovers), Brian Ruane (Ballina Stephenites), Peadar Gardiner (Crossmolina Deel Rovers), Damian Coleman (Ballintubber) and David McHale (Knockmore) have all received the Moclair Cup on two occasions.

Westport St Patricks A Brief History



The Ballina Stephenites Club was founded on the last Saturday of August 1886 by James Wallace Melvin. (Penname Larry Doolan) who also penned the Club's rallying song-"Forward to the goal of victory" The first meeting was held in "Barney's Boreen" at the top of Convent Hill. The first President of the Club was Tom Courell with "Cappy" Fitzgerald as Secretary and Michael Connolly as Treasurer. The club is named in honour of James Stephens (1825–1901).

Ballina Stephenites were affiliated to the Mayo County Board a short time later and played their first official fixture in Jones' Field in Ardnaree against Commercials Junior. The Club won 13 consecutive Senior Football Championships from 1904 - 1916 and 2 Archbishop Croke Cups in 1908 and 1909 and are the most successful club in Mayo with 38 county senior titles.

In 1933 James Stephens Park was opened by P. J. Ruttledge, Minister for Justice - (A Ballina man). Bord Na N'óg was founded in 1972 resulting in many juvenile successes since.

The Club hosted 2 G.A.A. Congress weeks in 1984 and 1985 and "Welcome Home Week" in 1984 - the Centenary year of the G.A.A. The Club has produced 5 G.A.A. Football All-Stars in Kevin McStay, Jimmy Browne, Liam McHale,

Ger Cafferkey and David Clarke.

In 2005 a team captained by Brian Ruane defeated Portlaoise to win the Andy Merrigan cup as All-Ireland Senior Club Football Championship winners.

Rev. Fr. Gerry Courell, grandson of Tom Courell and son of Gerald, was the club patron until his passing in May 2012, maintaining a proud family association with the club.

Last year Ballina Stephenites retained their senior title, and this afternoon they will be looking to win three titles in succession at the second time of asking, something they haven't succeeded in doing since winning six-in-arow between 1924 and 1929.

The first recorded account of a match involving Westport appeared in the Tuam News on 29th March 1889, when details were given of a match involving Westport McHales and Kilmeena, which the Westport men won by 1-6 to 0-0. In the early years of the GAA, a number of different combinations represented the parish, among them Derry Croaghpatricks, Aughagower, Attyreech, Murrisk Sunbursts and Westport Quay.

In the early years of the 20th century some success came to the parish. In 1907 final Derry Croaghpatricks lost to the mighty Ballina Stephenites of that period by the narrowest of margins 0-5 to 1-1. On their way to the final Derrycroaghpatricks had overcome Castlebar, Cong, Ardagh, and Ballinrobe. Aughagower won a junior championship in 1917, and Attyreech did the same in 1924. Westport contested the 1927 and 1929 senior finals unsuccessfully against Ballina.

The 1930s was a relatively successful decade, with county junior titles won in 1937 and 1940, when Belmullet and Balla were overcome respectively in finals. They also reached an Intermediate final in 1936 where they lost out to Ballycastle by 0-12 to 0-6. During this era also two of the clubs finest ever players Purty Kelly and Tommy Hoban represented Mayo and Connacht with distinction. Indeed Tommy had the honour of representing Connacht in the Railway Cup in both hurling and football, while Purty was a member of Mayo's first All Ireland senior winning team of 1936.

The 1940s heralded a lean period for the club, as many of the stalwarts of the 1930s retired from the scene. Murrisk did reach a junior final in 1944, where they lost

out to Belmullet. The lean spell continued throughout the 1950s, and the highlight of this period was the official opening of St Patricks GAA Park on 18th May, 1958, when Mayo played Galway in a challenge game to mark the occasion. This pitch was of great benefit to Mayo GAA, and was the traditional venue for the West Mayo Junior finals for many years.



The 1960s saw a concentration on underage affairs, and a number of titles were won. The West Mayo and County junior titles were won in 1970, and in 1971 the club reached its second Intermediate final, losing out to Ballaghaderreen. Continued progress saw Westport win the County Senior league in 1975. Since then the club have continued to be competitive in the senior and intermediate grades. They reached the county senior final in 1991, when they went down to Hollymount by 1-6 to 1-2, and in 2006 they took Crossmolina to a replay before going down in the semi-final. At underage level too, Westport have remained to the fore, winning many West Mayo titles and county titles.

Westport won the 2009 and 2016 Intermediate championships, when they overcame Tuar Mhic Eadaigh and Kiltimagh respectively in the finals. They followed on their 2016 win, by winning the Connacht and All-Ireland titles at Intermediate level, and since they have operated at Senior level, with their 2022 victory over Ballina Stephenites seeing them win the Moclair Cup for the first time. Today they will attempt to win their second Moclair Cup, following last weekend's drawn final.

- All persons entering the ground agree to be searched by a member of An Garda Siochana.
- 5. Every person entering the ground must have a ticket.
- 6. The following are not permitted:

6.1 Bringing into the ground fireworks, smoke canisters, bottles, glass, cans, flags, banners, poles, distress signals, laser pointers, and similar articles or containers, which could or might be used as a weapon.

6.2 Bringing of alcohol or controlled drugs into the ground.
6.3 The climbing of floodlights or pylons, stands or other buildings. Such behaviour constitutes trespass to property.
6.4 Excessive noise such as that from the use of radio sets, air horns and behaviour likely to cause confusion or nuisance of any kind including foul or abusive language.

6.5 Throwing of objects on to the pitch.

6.6 Entry upon the pitch, or engaging in conduct that causes or is likely to cause injury or harm to, or otherwise interferes with, disrupts, hinders or distracts a person playing in, refereeing or otherwise having a role in a match at this ground.

6.7 Any unauthorised contact with the boundary wall or fence surrounding the pitch or incursion onto the pitch. Any such unauthorised contact or incursion constitutes trespass to property.

- **6.8** Remaining or loitering in any gangway or aisle.
- 6.9 Behaving in an offensive or indecent manner.
- If a person commits a trespass, reasonable force may be used to prevent, restrain or terminate such trespass.
- 8. Where a person is in breach of any of these rules and regulations, or where Mayo GAA believes that a person constitutes a source of danger to others, or to the ground, such person may be refused entry or ejected from the ground, and reasonable force may be used for that numose
- All persons in the ground are reminded of their obligations under Section 18 (3) of the Fire Services Act, 1981, to ensure that behaviour does not present a danger from fire to anyone.



Smoking Policy

Mayo GAA now operates a No Smoking policy, including electronic cigarettes and nicotine vaporisers, in all parts of Hastings Insurance MacHale Park.
